

Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Reader: As the prophet Isaiah foretold: A child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Prince of Peace.

Three candles on the Advent wreath are already lit. As the fourth candle is being lit, the following is said:

Reader: We light this candle as a symbol of Christ our Peace.

After the candle has been lit, the following is said:

Reader: May the visitation of your Holy Spirit, O God, make us ready for the coming of Jesus, our love, our hope, our joy, and our peace.

The people respond: O come, O Come Emmanuel. Amen.

He abolishes the first in order to establish the second. ¹0And it is by God's will that we have been sanctified through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all.
